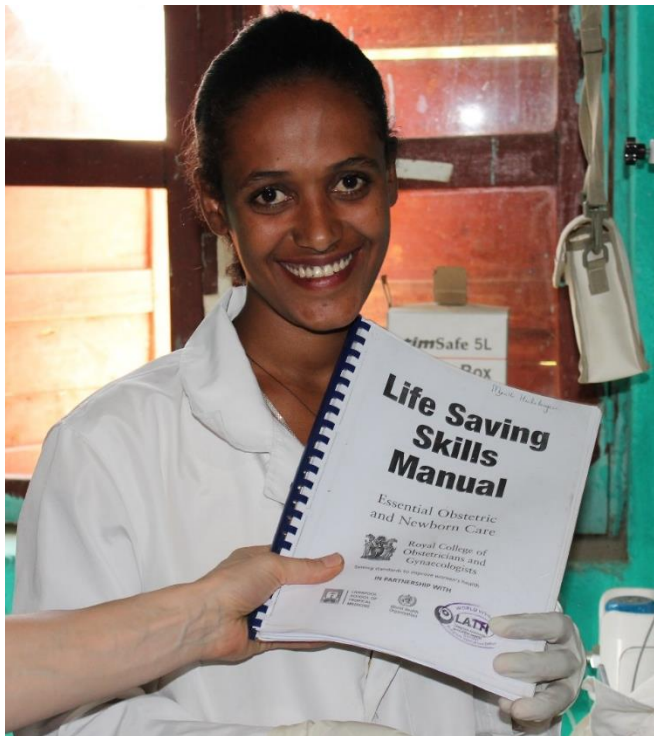

- 4 HC
- General impressions
 - buildings, labour wards, neonatal resuscitation
- Medical impressions
 - manual, self-confidence, vacuum extractor, drugs
- Statistical impressions
 - Overall: poor registration

 - Interview (LSTM format)
 - Practise skills







Life Saving Skills Training

- 27 trainees (11 HC, 11 midwives GOH, 5 residents)
- Trainers: 4 continu, 3 WP, local gynaecologists on and off
- Venue (met equipement locally and brought)





Life Saving Skills Training

Challenges and opportunities

- Trainers:
 - Plan: visit June ToT for trained residents and midwives.
 - Future: enrollment midwifery school, curriculum residents
- Financial:
 - Funding with help from WV
- Equipment: pelvis and doll voor VE, venous cut down set.
 - Local purchase
 - LSTM

Research

- Research Meeting
 - Several projects: maternal near miss criteria, baseline data severe maternal morbidity
 - 1 student project successfully completed
 - commitment in case of funding

Subspecialty training

- Main request: oncology, urogyn, feto-maternal (ultrasound, maternal ICU), laparoscopy
- Already collaboration with Germany on oncology / urogyn
- Preferably specialist for longer period, but with regular intervals also welcome

Conclusion

- LSS Training: follow- up health centers positive, training succesfull after improvising.
 - Plan: next training with residents /midwives. Evaluation after 1 year
 - Funding with help WV (apply for grant)
- Research: needs funding
 - plan: involvement Africa learning center / WV
